Looking back over this year I think we made progress in raising AIS awareness. However, we are beginning to realize that we need a solution to the zebra mussel invasion before it gets out of hand. We did a sweep of the upper lake, the channel and the lower lake. The bad news is that we found them everywhere. Another source of consternation this year is the heightened use of wake boats on Sylvan. Unfortunately, policing them is outside the purview of the Association or the Board. # **AIS Update**

On August 11, Dana Gutzmann, Cass County. AIS Technician, two others from Gull Lake and I did an AIS survey at the boat launch and no invasives were found. I got reports from a few board members that found many more zebra mussels along their shoreline this fall as compared to last year. I also received a report of zebra mussels in Lower Sylvan close to where the lake flows into Little Red Sand Lake, so I kayaked over there in October, put on my waders, and checked among the rocks and logs but did not find any.

Starry stonewort was discovered in a couple more lakes in Cass County during 2022, which is concerning. Starry stonewort is native to Eurasia, from the west coast of Europe to Japan. The species was unintentionally introduced into the United States' Great Lakes through the discharge of contaminated cargo ship ballast water. Starry stonewort impacts:

- Dense mats at the water's surface inhibit water recreationists
- Overtakes habitat and outcompetes native aquatic plants, potentially lowering diversity
- Provides unsuitable shelter, food, and nesting habitat for native animals
